150th Annual National WCTU Convention Held in Reno, Nevada

Reno, Nevada, August 7-11, 2023. The National Woman's Christian Temperance Union held its 150th Annual National Convention at the Whitney Peak Hotel in Reno, Nevada. In the delegation representing Illinois were members of the Normal WCTU. Loreta (Pres.) and Larry (Honorary) Jent.

WCTU delegates and members took a step back in time during a pre-convention event. They traveled to Virginia City which was a Mining Town in the 1880's.

The opening ceremony began with all State Presidents, dressed in their white gowns, marching into the convention hall carrying their state flag, which has always been their tradition. It was an honor to have World President Margaret Ostenstad travel from Norway to participate.

The national winners of the kindergarten, 1st grade, 2nd grade and 3rd grade coloring contests were announced, as well as the winners of the national poster and essay contests. Ribbons and prize money was awarded.

On Thursday evening the elected officers were sworn into office and given the "White Ribbon Salute" during a formal banquet.

NWCTU Presidents speech "Stay on the Wall"



The book of Nehemiah tells the story of a Jewish slave, cupbearer to the king of Persia, and his mission to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

Rebuilding is very much a part of life. Things often fall apart, and it seems we are always starting again. I think we can all agree, rebuilding is hard work. Once Nehemiah convinced the residents of Jerusalem to join in the effort to rebuild the walls, they had to deal with all sorts of obstacles. Today, walls that once provided protection against the enemy's schemes are crumbling all around us - in our families, our churches, our schools, our culture. God is calling His people to be men and women who, like Nehemiah, will trust Him with their lives and work to repair the damage in our world. Let me assure you: we will face the same obstacles faced by Nehemiah.

DISCOURAGEMENT

Tobiah, Sanballat and Geshem, fellow governors, wanted Nehemiah to fail because they saw Jerusalem's restoration as a threat to their own power. They mocked the Jews as feeble and claimed the wall could not even stop a prowling fox, much less an attacking army. I suppose one could say this was psychological warfare intended to demoralize the laborers.

Consistency turns small beginnings into real progress. The prophet Zechariah said, "Do not despise these small beginnings, for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin." (Zech 4:10) Whatever you may be trying to 'rebuild': remember how Nehemiah dealt with the hecklers. He turns the voice of discouragement into a prayer. Fear and discouragement have a mute button. That mute button is called faith. Turn off the negative voices and give them to God. Listen to the voice of God's truth instead.

DEBRIS

Before they could even get to the broken walls, they had to dig out the stones that had been knocked down 150 years earlier.

Nehemiah 4:10, "Meanwhile, the people in Judah said, "The strength of the laborers is giving out, and there is so much rubble that we cannot rebuild the wall."

Rebuilding is more difficult than building be-

Rebuilding is more difficult than building because one must deal with all the junk (rubble) that came before.

Let's think for a moment about the WCTU. We have a beautiful 'campus' located in Evanston, Illinois that includes "Rest Cottage", home of Frances Willard that is a National Museum, two houses with two apartments on either side AND a brick three-story building long known as the Administration building. For many years this large brick building was left unattended with no upkeep, and we were told we did not have any money to keep it up. Following a change in leadership, a manager was secured, and things began to look different.

At no cost to the WCTU, the monies from the rent on the apartments were sufficient to begin updating rooms on the first floor. Updating was completed on the first floor and we were able to rent out two offices to women who have counseling practices. Then came the present day Tobiahs, Sanballats, and Geshams, and work was stopped as we were making plans for the second floor. Again, notice how Nehemiah dealt with his hecklers. In Nehemiah 4:4 he turned the voice of discouragement into a prayer. He let God deal with them. Turn off the negative voices and give the hecklers to God. Determination for a better day is what kept the people of Jerusalem motivated and it will do the same for us in this our 150th year.

DISTRACTIONS

Nehemiah 4:7-9: "But when Sanballat, Tobiah, the Arabs, the Ammonites and the people of Ashdod heard that the repairs to Jerusalem's walls had gone ahead and that the gaps were being closed, they were very angry. They all plotted together to come and fight against Jerusalem and stir up trouble against it. But we prayed to our God and posted a guard day and night to meet this threat." Nehemiah adjusted his plan so that he could accomplish his purpose. Things will come up that we cannot anticipate, and Nehemiah teaches us to make flexible plans around a firm purpose. What he did not do was stop working!

DANGER

Change, even good and needed, brings with it opposition.

Ten times Nehemiah received reports that people were planning to attack and kill them to stop their progress. Here's how he responded: Nehemiah posted whole families, fully armed, near the weakest places in the wall. During some of the rebuilding process, he tells us that the people held a weapon in one hand and built with the other. Each group had a trumpet so they could call for help when under attack. Threats of warfare did not stop the work. They just had to assume a posture of readiness. They carried their weapons even when they went to get a drink of water. Nehemiah also called the people to remember their why: "Remember the Lord, who is great and awesome, and fight for your families, your sons and your daughters, your wives and your homes."

(Neh 4:14b)

Whatever you may be trying to rebuild, always keep in mind WHY it is important to you. This is what led to Nehemiah's success. In just 52 days, the people of Jerusalem restored the walls of the city. I am inviting you to join me in rebuilding the WCTU. We have been through some tough hardships and setbacks in the last few years. We can restore much of what we have lost but I need you to be very faithful to your local WCTU and find your

niche, your purpose. God used Nehemiah because he was willing to be used and rebuilding the wall was important for his people.

The only thing that really troubled Nehemiah was the opposition, the naysayers and the critics, but he never lost sight of where he was going and what he was about. Don't think for one minute that Mother Thompson, the women of the Crusades, Mrs. George Carpenter, Frances Willard, and Annie Wittenmyer had it easy.

Nehemiah's had one final challenge. He said, Sanballat and Geshem sent him a message, "Come and let us meet together in one of the villages in the plain of Ono. But they intended to do me harm."

"They sent to me four times in this way, and I answered them in the same manner . . . I am doing a great work and I cannot come down. Why should the work stop while I leave it to come down to you?" He stayed on the wall! They sent him an unsealed letter full of lies. He sent a reply: "Nothing like what you are saying is happening: you are just making it up out of your head." He stayed on the wall! They tried to frighten him, saying "Their hands will get too weak for the work, and it will not be completed." But he prayed, "Now strengthen my hands." And he stayed on the wall!

Stay on the wall, people. Don't come down giving in to the lies of our enemies; don't come down to reason with the Sanballats, the Geshams or the Tobiahs.

We are building something that the world needs. We are building something that your children and grandchildren need. We are building something that the children in your neighborhood need. We are building something that the young mothers in your church and community need. Are you willing to stay with the business of building for the world what it needs?



The ninth WHO report on the global tobacco epidemic tracks the progress made by countries in tobacco control since 2008 and, marks 15 years since the introduction of the MPOWER technical package which is designed to help countries implement the demand reduction measures of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control.

As the chart shows, around 79% of WHO member countries have introduced warning labels on packaging. At the same time, almost 38% of the surveyed countries have implemented strict regulations on public areas where drinking is not permitted, while a similar share have strict ban on tobacco advertising.

An estimated 8.7 million people are killed from tobacco each year, according to the WHO. Of these, 1.3 million people don't use tobacco directly themselves but are exposed to it second-hand. Therefore, protecting people from tobacco smoke should be a national project.

6 measures are intended to assist in the country-level implementation of effective interventions to reduce the demand for tobacco, contained innthe WHO FCTC (WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control).

The 6 MPOWER measures





(1. Monitoring tobacco use; 2. Protecting people from tobacco smoke; 3. Quitting tobacco; 4. Warning about the dangers of tabacco; 5. Enforcing tabacco advertising, promotion & sponsorship bans 6. Raising taxes on tobacco)
